Notes: This plan is applicable to the traditional classroom face-to-face delivery method and the online option for organizational leadership majors, and includes Foundation Track courses. This plan is ONE way in which you can complete your degree program in four years; it is not the only way. This plan assumes that you are not a transfer student and that you are beginning in the fall.

- 1General Education notes: Organizational Leadership strongly recommends completing written communication I, oral communication, and statistics in your first year; written communication II and PSY 100 for individual and society in your second year. How you sequence the remainder of the general education program requirements is up to you.
- 2 Organizational Leadership requires a statistics course for Foundation of Knowledge (general education) Scientific & Quantitative Inquiry: Mathematics and Statistics. Students should choose from STA 113, STA 205, or STA 205R. Statistics is a prerequisite for LDR 310 (it must be completed prior to enrolling in LDR 310). Additionally, LDR 310 must be completed prior to registering for LDR 480 (save LDR 480 for the last semester).
- 3 Foundation track students are required to take LDR 117, LDR 160, LDR 205 and a second course from the approved pool of Leadership Electives. If you are not a foundation track student, you should register for an elective course. Please see your advisor for guidance on selecting an appropriate course.
- 4 Completing PSY 100 satisfies three of the six credit hours required for Foundation of Knowledge: Self and Society: Individual and Society category, and also fulfills the prerequisite for PSY 340 and PSY 344 (you must complete PSY 100 before enrolling in PSY 340 or PSY 344).
- 5 It is recommended to complete at least one of your two sciences by the end of your sophomore year. Completing your natural sciences with lab requirement in your second year is recommended but not required.
- 6 When completing your secondary area of study (minor or focus), be sure to select enough 300-level or above coursework to complete the university requirement of 45 credit hours of 300-level or above coursework. The organizational leadership major supplies 33 to 36 credit hours of 300-level coursework. Choose 12 credit hours of electives and/or secondary area of study courses at the 300 level or above to meet the 45 credit hours of 300-level or above requirement.
- 7 The Organizational Leadership Program recommends that students pursue LDR 396 or another variable credit hour elective course in order to avoid exceeding the minimum 120 credit hours required for graduation.
